#### COUNTRY COOKING & FORAGING FOR FOOD For the promotion of Health & Wellbeing by Cath Bromwich



#### Versatile weeds and paradigm shifts

Dandelions are weeds...and edible! It is similarly mind

blowing that nettles are stingy...and edible! It is time to think on these things as we have again entered the busy 'spring greens' foraging season.

There are already some lovely fat dandelion flowers happily bobbing about in the breeze. Find some kids and head off for a walk.

I go above Silsden to fields just below the moorland. I pick as many dandelion flower heads as my child labour are willing to and return home to stew up these unsung wonders of the foragers' arsenal.

Another surprising point about these flowers is that they bring flavours into our British pallet which are more commonly associated with exotic delicacies, producing a delicious nutty, vanilla flavour. Other wild plants also do this. It is interesting that some flavours that are brought from so far can be reproduced here with a smaller environmental footprint.

However 'foreign' these tastes seem many remember a time that 'Dandelion and Burdock' was a common drink and you will recognise the distinct flavours in the dandelion flower syrup recipe below (from my most used and loved foraging book 'Seaweed and eat it'). Also during the Second World War people made a substitute coffee out of dandelion roots and the leaves are very good in a salad and served as 'mountain greens' abroad.

Dandelion syrup adds flavour and sweetness to baklava or cake, can be used as a drink or on ices (see my facebook for the baklava recipe).

Take care about where you pick these delicacies from as 'oh du dog doo' is not good, also dandelion has substances in that are not great for people with kidney issues so avoid if that is an issue. Additionally: I'll be on TV doing some foraging soon I'll keep you posted. 'Lilies' in Keighley and I have started a cookery club for budget cookery be in touch if interested to take part & volunteer. Top Tip: Don't be put off by the smell that heating the flower heads makes, this will be transformed into a wonderful nutty aroma.

### **Dandelion Syrup Recipe**

from Seaweed and eat it a family foraging and cooking adventure. By Fiona Houston and Xa Milne

4 Cups of dandelion flower heads 1.1 1/3 pints of water

. I I/ 3 pints of wat

1.2 900g/ 2LB sugar 1/2 Lemon or orange chopped into pieces

Put the dandelion flowers in a large saucepan and add the water.

Bring just to the boil, turn off heat, cover and leave overnight.

Strain and press liquid out of spent flowers. Discard the flowers and retain the liquid.

Add sugar to the flower liquid and the chopped fruit and heat slowly, gently stirring frequently.

Do this until the liquid is reduced and you have a thick honey-like syrup.

Wipe up spills immediately. Store in the fridge in a clean sealed jar.

### fields of vision

#### A competition is launched to find 'Yorkshire symbol' for huge land art project, as Keelham Farm Shop backs Yorkshire Festival's 'Fields of Vision'

Fields of Vision, an idea put forward by the Worth Valley Young Farmers Club, is being delivered in a bespoke partnership co-ordinated by the rural regeneration specialists, Pennine Prospects, and involves a number of local artists as well as local arts festivals and community groups throughout the county. The project will see a series of huge field-scale land art installations, visible by land and sky forming the backdrop of day two of the Tour de France Grand Départ.

Until now, the project partners have been working exclusively with commissioned artists to create the designs but with Keelham on board and a spare field in need of an original design, the team decided to launch a competition open to anyone with a good idea. Entrants must draw a simple, bold design which, to them, symbolises Yorkshire. A winner will be selected by a panel of judges including Victoria Robertshaw, co-owner of Keelham Farm Shop; Andrew Wood, club leader of the Worth Valley Young Farmers' Club; Elizabeth Barker from local community group Worth the Tour; Geoff Wood from public art consultancy, Working pArts; and lan Thompson from design agency, Thompson Brand Partners. The winning entry will be interpreted on the site by the Fields of Vision team to create a vast and vibrant grass-roots installation.

Comments Victoria Robertshaw, co-owner of Keelham Farm Shop: "At Keelham we love Yorkshire and farming is our lifeblood, so we are really excited to support one of the sites in the Field of Visions project."

The field - located in Hainworth, in Keighley, Worth Valley - can be viewed from the Sue Belcher Community Centre where local people are now sowing seeds for a new community garden which will be the best viewing spot from which to admire the stunning land art below.

Adds Victoria: "We're delighted also to help the local community garden to get off the ground, by donating bulbs, seeds and pots. The project team will be working with local schools and students will be encouraged to grow coloured turf which will be planted at the centre to help mark the viewing spot."

### **Collaborative Craven Parish Councils**



The Tour De France will see its Grand Depart pass through our areas on Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th July. This is the world's biggest one day sporting event and is expected to attract approximately 4 million visitors.

This is both a once in a lifetime opportunity and a major potential disruption for the weekend. In order to make the best of this event Addingham, Silsden and Steeton with Eastburn parish councils have been working closely together to ensure they are ready for the event.

Mayor of Silsden Chris Atkinson has been impressed by the number of people who have come together to help prepare the town for the Tour.

"A group of at least 20 people have



formed a committee to coordinate various activities in Sillsden with the Churches together promoting the knitting of small yellow Jerseys which will be hung as bunting for the Tour but afterwards will be sent to Africa for new born babies to wear. Other projects that are being considered include a treasure hunt made up of bicycles which will be open to everyone including businesses."





Addingham and Silsden have also been working with Bradford Council to identify additional car parking space; places for additional toilets and potential camp sites. It is important that we ensure that disruption is kept to a minimum."

Catherine Coates Chair of Addingham Parish Council has also been heavily involved in the planning activity. "The idea has really gripped the village and we have already held a number of meetings which have been attended by over 160 people all keen to know more. The coordinating group has a brought together the council; residents and businesses to help plan the event. We have already had the BBC's Inside Out programme filming in the village and we expect the interest to grow as we get closer to the event. We have already seen a real interest in some of the merchandise that businesses in the village have been selling."

David Mullen Chair of Steeton with

Easthurn Parish Council has also seen a surge of interest . "We recently hosted a meeting with Welcome to Yorkshire which allowed people to see the size of the event. Its not just about the 200 hundred cyclists the actual event will last for hours with the race itself preceded by a "caravan" of sponsors vehicles giving a whole range of gifts to the spectators. We are lucky to have a time trial on the bypass between Silden and Steeton roundabout and Keighley. We expect this to be very popular with part of the bypass being turned into a car park and viewing area.

However, this could also mean that the bypass is closed on the Saturday night to allow all the timing gantries to be erected."

The Tour is coming and Addingham, Silsden and Steeton with Eastburn are preparing to make the most of the opportunity as well as preparing for the inevitable disruption that it will bring. The Tour will not return to Yorkshire in our life time so this is a unique opportunity. Anyone wishing to know more should look at the following websites:

### **Adios XP! Looking** forward, not back.

Plenty of dates in the next few months are going to be important for one reason or another. End of the football season in May (C'mon Liverpool!), 20th World Cup in June, the Tour de France Grand Depart in July. Lots to look forward to. There's one date of particular importance coming up much sooner though... 8th April 2014.

If you're a Windows XP user, take note. 8th April is when Microsoft finally pulls the plug. No more support or updates. A shock? Where have you been for the last few years? Thinking 'Cripes! How will this affect me?'? Read on...

Q. Why end support of a popular and stable product? A. It's business. New cars wouldn't sell, if old ones were safer. Same with computers. Businesses clina on to legacy products for too long, thinking it will save them money. It rarely does, because

productivity is hindered. There's been 3 new versions of Windows since XP. OK. so one of them (Vista) was 'something of a let-down', shall we say, but technology has moved on, A lot. The new Microsoft products are designed to work well together. If you want Office 2013 you need Windows 7 or 8. If you want to get the best out of Microsoft's cloud-based Office 365 you really need Office 2013 (although it will work OK with 2010 and some functionality will work if you use Office 2007). If you're unwilling to try new things, you won't know what you're missing!

S. But if I don't want to (or can't really afford to) upgrade to a newer version of Windows, will XP just stop working on 8th April? A. No! XP will still work. You just won't get any new Windows updates to fix security issues or any help from Microsoft. Most anti-virus

malware, which is, typically, the way hackers go

about getting onto your computer these days,

but there's no guarantees. Better to upgrade

or replace your PC, or disconnect it from the

internet permanently. If you can't, then accept

that it just won't be secure, and your data won't

Q. If my XP computer has software problems, will they still be fixable? A. Probably. Independent support providers won't forget XP overnight, but they will get 'rusty'. I see the occasional Windows 2000 or Windows NT PC in our workshop, but when I do it's only oldies like me, who have hands-on experience of these products. Don't expect to find XP compatible drivers for new hardware either. If a part (e.g. graphics card) fails on an XP PC you may be offered only used parts.

So long XP! A great product of its time, yes, but 'so 2001'. Like the original iPod and the Mondeo Mk2 (and you know how out of date they look now...)
