

East Riddlesden Hall by Antony Silson

East Riddlesden Hall goes in to hibernation during the winter months, and it is only with the stirring of Spring (which is more welcome than ever after the winter we've just had that it rises from it's slumber. Very much the quieter, more serene of the big Keighley attractions; it is Mole to Cliffe Castle's Badger and the KWVR's Ratty, I think. I'm not sure what Toad would be though in this analogy. The point I'm trying to make is that it knows it's strengths and doesn't like to shout too much about them. A solid sort of a chap, if you get my meaning. Someone reliable, and dependable . If you look up the forthcoming activities you see everything from Butter Making to a Gin Festival to Build A Mini Raft for Father's Day. It knows how to hook you and reel you in.

Built by arch Royalist James Murgatroyd in 1642, East Riddlesden Hall is a Grade 1 listed building. Yes, a Grade One listed building tucked away, just out of sight in Keighley. Murgatroyd so loved the Royal Family that you can see the heads of his beloved Charles I and Henrietta Maria of France (me neither) carved in the stonework in the tearooms. For all those

interested in England's turbulent past, who desire to extricate themselves from the present for a short time, there are priest holes, walled gardens, medieval tithe barns and not one, but two, Yorkshire Rose Windows. There are even rumours of several ghosts wandering the house looking for something that is always just out of reach.

One of the great things about East Riddlesden Hall is the tranquility and solitude that you find wandering about the duck pond or the gardens. If you travel there by bus then you can get a further £1 off your ticket. What's not to like?

We have welcomed a Royal visitor, and some might say it was a little ironic that the steam locomotive named after 'Oliver Cromwell' visited the line just a few weeks later. We ran demonstration freight trains,



as well as double-headed specials, during our Gala weekend in March, and saw the first of the year's 'Haworth Haddock' fish

and chip specials. We also ran seven days per week during the Easter and half-term holidays, before reverting to operating at weekends and the Diesel Railcar services on Wednesdays.

We have over a week of special 50th celebrations planned beginning on Sunday 24th, and continue, with Royal Scot hauling pre-booked trains from June 25th to June 27th. Please do visit the Railway's website to secure a seat on the Royal Scot specials and to see the details of the events, which run through to 1st July, with various visiting locomotives and themed days, and most importantly the re-creation of the original re-opening train that left Keighley at 235pm on June 29th, back in 1968. We are still very keen to hear from anyone who was on the re-opening train, or who was watching or volunteering on that special day, so please do get in touch so we can get you involved with the anniversary events.

2018 sees us running our inaugural 'Food & Drink Festival' on 9th and 10th June, which offers a weekend of Artisan foods



and drinks, with food and drink stalls, including a range of fine wines, ciders, gins and real ales and a wide range of delicacies to enjoy.

As ever, we also continue to run steam trains every weekend and during school holidays, as well as the Railcar Wednesday service continuing to prove popular. It is also good to note that we are dog friendly.

To make all this happen requires a huge effort by our volunteers and small group of paid team members. Whilst we have well over 500 volunteers already, we are always keen to welcome more. We offer full training and assessment for a wide range of operational roles, but always need volunteers to help with the behindthe-scenes activities. Ingredients:

2 tbsp hazelnut oil

400 grams French beans 400 grams Mangetout 2 spring onions, finely chopped 70 grams unskinned hazelnuts I orange I or 2 garlic clove, crushed 3 tbsp olive oil

Method:

Pre-heat oven to 180 °C (or you can grill if it seems excessive to put the oven on for a tray of nuts, but keep a close eye on them!)Scatter hazelnuts on baking tray; roast in oven for 10 mins. Allow to cool and then rub in tea towel to remove skins.

Trim stalk ends off French beans and mangetout, keeping the two separate. Bring unsalted water to the boil in a large saucepan. Blanch French beans in the water; after 3 mins add mangetout & cook for 1 more min. Drain and tip into bowl of cold water, drain & dry.

Chop nuts.

Remove orange zest with vegetable peeler, and cut into strips.

Juice half an orange; add to the garlic, spring onions and both oils, (use a different oil if you don't have hazelnut). Mix all ingredients in a bowl and add dressing – serve at room temperature.

Other vegetables can be use, broad beans, peas, courgette ribbons.

When in 2007 I retired from West Yorkshire Police, I found myself needing to clear my head from thirty-three years immersion in the gutter of life. Brontë Parsonage Museum at 90

A History of the Museum in 10 Objects



Grasper - from life by Emily Brontë, 1834

When I look at Emily's little sketch of the family's Irish terrier Grasper, it's clear to me that she is giving us a picture of a very real dog, with a character of his own, caught in a particular moment. Bristlehaired and alert, he has an expression of hopeful expectation that any dog owner will recognise. Unless very different from most of his kind, what he was likely hoping for was a good long walk, or some kind of tasty morsel. In the Brontës' household, and particularly under Emily's care, neither would have been in short supply. Charlotte's friend Ellen Nussey writes of Emily and Anne sneaking Grasper into the parlour against their aunt Branwell's rules, and feeding him their breakfast, and as for walks, what was there that Emily would rather do than step out across her beloved moors with her beloved dogs? We have little actual information about

Grasper. We know his breed, that he is wearing at this point a leather collar. (though we have a one of brass we also think was his, complete with an intriguing tuft of hair) and that he had a liking for porridge. We do know though, that animals were always around the Brontës and part of everyday life at the Parsonage; we read accounts of pet geese being fed, a falcon's wing mended, a cat called Tyger being everyone's favourite. There are several doggy anecdotes that have come down to us, but they're usually about the more famous and seemingly charismatic Keeper.

Emily was known for her affinity with animals, probably on the whole preferring them to people. But she didn't sentimentalise them. She embraced the savage aspects of their nature as well as the gentle, and part of her love of the family pets seemed to be the sense of a latent wildness and ferocity, still to be alimpsed if you looked for it. All this fits easily with our ideas of Emily and that fierceness in her own writing, but what I like about this picture, is something more tender that comes through, something more personal and immediate. Emily Brontë is a writer of colossal stature, but this sketch reminds us she was once a fifteen year old girl with a pencil in her hand. Her little terrier, eager for a walk one day sits in front of her with a particularly loveable expression, and she grabs a piece of paper...




