



OUR FAMILY FAVOURITES

Over the next few months we will be featuring recipes from our friends and neighbours in the beautiful Worth and Aire Valleys. We would like to learn more about the people who live here and the things they love to cook for family and friends. Our first recipe comes from Nathan Downing. Nathan was born and bred in Haworth. He's a plasterer by day and a talented cook and musician by night.

Nathan's Favourite Pumpkin Tart

This is a delicious way to use up the flesh from carved Halloween pumpkins. The tart can be served either warm or cold. For Nathan, it is perfect when served warm with ice cream!

Ingredients

I Pack ready rolled shortcrust pastry 450g pumpkin cut into small chunks 100g soft brown sugar

Pinch of salt

1/2 tsp each of cinnamon, ginger and nutmeg I tablespoon honey

3 eggs, beaten

Grated zest of I lemon and juice of $\frac{1}{2}$ Grated zest of I orange and juice of $\frac{1}{2}$

Method

Remove pastry from the fridge an hour before start. Grease and dust with icing sugar a 20cm flan tin. Line the tin with pastry, leaving some excess over the edge to prevent shrinking. Place the lined tin in the fridge for 30 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 180C / gas mark 4. Prick all over the bottom of the tart with a fork, cover with greaseproof paper and weigh down with rice or baking beans. Bake the pastry case blind for 20-25 minutes. remove from the oven and let it cool slightly. Carefully trim off the excess pastry from around the edge of the flan case and remove the baking beans and paper. To make the filling, steam the pumpkin for around 15 minutes, until very tender. Press down on the cooked pumpkin to remove the excess liquid. Allow the pumpkin to cool then place in a blender with all the other ingredients except the eggs and puree until smooth. Add the eggs and blend again. Pour the mixture into the pastry case and bake for 55 minutes or until a skewer comes out from the centre clean. Allow to cool in the tin. Remove from tin and dust

with icing sugar. Enjoy!



It's literally been 'all hands to the pumps' over the past few weeks at the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway as we have hosted our annual Beer & Music Festival. during which our volunteers were kept busy serving thirsty visitors from a choice of over 150 beers, ciders and gins. As well as the hundreds of volunteers needed to run the event, there are countless hours spent setting up and the same putting the Railway back to normal after the last of the many pints has been supped. This level of commitment and enthusiasm is typical of our volunteers, who as well as hosting the Festival have recently completed a significant engineering project on the embankment near Mytholmes Tunnel and are in the final stages of planning for a bridge replacement in the Spring, as we work to maintain the 150+ year old infrastructure. This work is vital to keep the trains running for many generations to come, as is the effort needed to overhaul and care for the Railway's fleet of steam locomotives and carriages. As you look out of the windows of our heritage trains, you pass through the beautifully-restored stations, which take on a whole new charm as the gas lighting illuminates the dark

evenings and the roaring fire in the booking hall keeps out the winter chill.



The 'little books'.... and one in particular

The little books made by the Brontës when they were children are some of the most treasured items in the Museum's collection. They document a whole imaginary word created by the Brontës in childhood, which was sparked when Patrick gifted a set of toy soldiers to Branwell. The tiny manuscripts, just the size of a matchbox, were intended to be small enough for the toy soldiers to read, but their size also meant that their contents could be kept secret from the watchful eyes of Patrick and Aunt Branwell. The books were inspired by Blackwood's magazine, which was read avidly by all the Brontë family. Each tiny manuscript includes a mix of prose and poetry, some of it clearly influenced by Byron whose work was enjoyed by the young Brontës. Some of the little books also contain reviews and advertisements.

The Brontë Society is currently fundraising for a little book that will be auctioned in Paris on 18 November. It was created by Charlotte Brontë when she was just fourteen years old and is one in a sequence of six of which the Brontë Parsonage Museum already has four. Together they chart Charlotte Brontë's development as a writer and reveal how many of her

early themes carry over into her published novels. Dated 19 August 1830, this particular manuscript, which has never been published, recounts how a murderer is driven to madness after being haunted by his victims, and how 'an immense fire' burning in his head causes his bed curtains to set alight, prefiguring the well-known scene in Jane Eyre, in which Rochester's insane wife sets light to his bed curtains. If you've never visited the Museum and seen one of these little books for yourself, we urge you to do so. These rare and precious manuscripts are among the most popular of exhibits with visitors and never fail to enchant.

Some readers may recall that this little book first came to light in 2011 when it was auctioned at Sotheby's in London.

Despite a successful fundraising campaign, the Society was outbid by a private organisation: heart-breaking for all our staff. We've now got another chance to bring it home to Haworth for future generations to enjoy - the perfect Christmas present for all of us.


