KEIGHLEY & WORTH VALLEY RAILWAY



At the railway's recent Annual General Meeting, I was very humbled to be re-elected Chairman for another year, along with the eighteen other members of the

Board of the Society, the Vice Presidents and our long standing President, former MP for Keighley, Ann Cryer. Ann was the one who received the phone call from Lionel Jeffries' "people" when they were considering where to film The Railway Children, and the railway's - and indeed the whole visitor economy of the whole area - could have been so very different if she had missed the call or not answered the questions so skilfully, the outcome of which was the iconic family film that is now synonymous with Oakworth. We were so fortunate that the film crew fell in love with the location and that they chose not to change the station name to a fictitious location.

My role as Chairman requires me to help the Board consider opportunities and challenges that the railway faces. We have an operating company Board whose focus is on the day-to-day safe and commercial operation of the railway, whilst the Society's focus is on the longer term strategy and funding requirements. **The Society's Board current concerns include**

 how to ensure we have the quality of engineering facility and skills to continue operations in the longer term,because we are very aware of how much experience and knowledge needs passing on to future generations

- refurbishment of the water tower at Keighley Station, which is a key part of our operational infrastructure, but also a fantastic example of a Midland Railway structure, so its historical importance should be recognised and passengers able to understand its heritage
- consideration of how best to show off the splendour of Oakworth station to passengers. We wish to retain the Edwardian charm of the station building, but are under pressure to upgrade the toilet facilities, for example, to make them more accessible and to explain the story of filming The Railway Children at the station.

We are considering reinstating the former wooden structures that were located in the yard to house such additions.

 There are a number of other projects, such as fundraising for the overhaul of the locomotive that hailed the reopening train in June 1968, which we will be celebrating in 2018 and hope that the train can be largely recreated for the 50th Anniversary. Underpinning all of these projects is finance, but more importantly the time that our people have to deliver such plans. We have recently requested from the membership volunteers to help manage these projects, and are working on developing a skills database from our membership to help identify relevant experience that we can use to the benefit of the railway. This month we meet Danielle Cadamarteri, Retail Manager at the Brontë Parsonage Museum. The shop, which has a fantastic range of books, Brontë souvenirs and gifts for lovers of literature everywhere, is open daily for visitors and local residents alike. What's more, visiting the museum first is not compulsory!

Tell us a little about yourself:

I've always had a huge passion for the arts – I've played classical guitar since the age of nine, and studied at both Leeds then Bradford College of Art. I'm a thoroughly Yorkshire lass, despite the name... and I'm proud of our heritage, I feel that it really is a huge part of our identity, to be cherished and preserved.

How long have you worked at the Museum?

Sixteen months. I worked as a senior manager for a multinational company for a few years and feel my role at the Parsonage is the perfect amalgamation of both my passion and vocation.

Tell us about a typical day:

Too variable to be typical! Aside from daily retail operations including overseeing the deployment, merchandising, processing deliveries and invoices etc, I routinely go out on sourcing trips, to liaise with suppliers and commission new products. I am making a huge effort to source ethical products such as Fairtrade as I believe it's essential for us to support the fact that Haworth is the world's first Fairtrade village and I am particularly keen to work with more local artists, again to support the local community. We are doing an increasing amount of trade off-site at events such as the Great Yorkshire Show and The Women's Institute Centennial Fair as well as book stalls at various literary events.

What's your favourite piece in the collection? (or product in the shop)

I am particularly fond of Emily Brontë's Christening mug, which I spent a considerable time studying in order to develop a reproduction for retailing. I have since been familiarising myself with Charlotte Brontë's jewellery which is really exciting for reasons other than the fact that I'm a bit of a magpie – watch this space!

And your favourite Brontë novel?

Truthfully, I haven't read them all so I cannot make a fully informed opinion. I have drawn lots of inspiration from Jane Eyre whilst developing one of our new ranges, my favourite quote being "I would always rather be happy than dignified", such an admirably bold statement to made almost 200 years ago – and definitely one of my life mottos.

Anything else you'd like to tell us?

I'm eagerly anticipating the launch of our Bicentenary celebrations – we've got a couple of really exciting creative partnerships for retail on the horizon, as part of our Bicentenary ranges. We've made such a lot of progress with the shop in recent months and I really feel like it's coming into its own. **Finally, we're open late on Thursday 26 November – why don't you come along for some sherry and shopping?**
